Bais Menachem is a very unique Jewish institution. We have made it our mission to help those young men who have found it difficult to succeed in the traditional Yeshiva setting. Whether due to an inability to concentrate in the classroom, social issues at home or school, lack of motivation, or a diminishing interest in religious values, we seek to clearly identify any problems that may be impeding progress, and find a wholesome solutions so that our students will rise above their challenges and flourish.

The mission of Bais Menachem is to provide an alternative to the mainstream Yeshiva system for alienated and disaffected teenage boys. Bais Menachem maintains a student body of no more than 25 students in order to allow for individualized attention, guidance, and support for our students.

These goals are accomplished by providing year-round programming of Judaic and general studies, and an abundance of recreational activities in a warm, non-judgmental environment. We aim to help our students identify the positive qualities in themselves, through cooperative goal setting for each individual.

Building self-esteem and life skills in our students is central to our mission. This is accomplished by actively involving our students in community service on an ongoing basis.
